



Father's Day is an opportunity to honour fatherhood and the influence that fathers have in society. In parts of Europe, it has been celebrated since the Middle Ages. In the USA, Father's Day was celebrated for the first time in 1910. Father's Day wasn't originally well received in the 1910s and 1920s in Australia as many thought it was either unnecessary or undermining of a father's assumed "supremacy" as head of the household. Australian newspapers at the time printed satirical poems and critical editorials of the new "American" tradition. It wasn't until the 1930s that Father's Day became popularly celebrated in Australia.

I have been fortunate to have a great father who I have always looked up to and respected. Dad was always a positive role model and very supportive. He is a wealth of knowledge and always a great help with any project / task that was required. Whenever I ask Dad for advice, he always has some good, useful wisdom to share. I have shared many fond memories with my dad growing up like fishing / croc spotting down the river in Weipa (far north Queensland), family trip to the tip of Australia (Cape York), playing tennis with Dad, watching movies with Dad, playing 500 with Dad or just chatting. For as long as I can remember Dad has always been there to support me and I am truly grateful for him.

While I'm sure many of us have had a great earthly father, I appreciate that not everyone has necessarily had a positive earthly father experience. Be assured that God our heavenly Father cares for you deeply and wants the very best for you and quite possibly has placed fatherlike figures in your life to help you at specific times.

What does the Bible say about Fathers?

- Fathers lead / teach / instruct Genesis 18:19, Ephesians 6:4, Proverbs 1:8, 4:1-4, 4:10-13, 22:6, Deuteronomy 6:1-9.
- Fathers care / love Psalm 103:13, Luke 15:20, Deuteronomy 1:29-31,
 Proverbs 3:11-12, Ephesians 5:25-33, Colossians 3:19-21.
- Fathers provide stability 1 Corinthians 16:13-14, 1 Timothy 3:2-5.
- Fathers take pride in their kids Proverbs 23:24, 3 John 1:4.

In summary, Father's Day is a great opportunity to celebrate the deep, God-given desire to respect and love the honourable men in our lives (whether they are your earthly father or a fatherlike figure in your life). These are the men who have shaped us, invested in us, supported us, been patient with us and given us the love and stability we have needed to become the people we are today. Give thanks to God for these people today and show them how much you care and appreciate them.

Prayer Focus for September

Ask of me, and I will make the nations your inheritance; the whole wide world will be your possession.

Psalm 2:8 (Complete Jewish Bible)

I have heard recently that prayer is bending our will to God's. It is surrendering and inclining our hearts to what God is asking and calling us towards (2 Chronicles 7:14), while also releasing a presence and encounter atmosphere. In September, let's shift the focus towards our inheritance by focusing each week on a one-time prayer focus, asking the Holy Spirit to lead and deepen us to deep uttering prayers. Romans 8:26

Week 1 PRAYER - ask of me

Friends, I ask you to lift up in prayer our mission collectively. Our calling is to step into a renewal of life and faith for our future, and to reimagine us as a faith community spiritually and supernaturally. Ask God to reveal and stir our hearts, leading us to repentance and awakening His kingdom in us! Make it personal: What is one prayer you could pray that God cannot ignore?



Prayer Focus for September

Week 2 PROMISE - and I will

How about we pray in a way that not only invites God's promises but transforms our asking? What kind of praying could open up heaven according to our high calling? In what ways do you believe God will release his word in your situation? Remember, no matter how many promises God has made, they are 'Yes' in Christ'. Prayers to free you and show you how to become all he requires. Make it personal: Pray in a way that unleashes a heart of self - for the heart of God.

Week 3 POTENTIAL - make the nations

We should never consider prayer as twisting God's hand or heart. We serve the God and creator of the universe. Jesus taught us to think big! Pray faith-filled, daring, stretching prayers. Why pray prayers that the neighbour up the street could answer? Make it personal.

Week 4 POWER - your inheritance.

Paul said, "I can do all things through Christ, who gives me strength". The devil hates that verse. If only we knew what was at our disposal. The world, the devil, has caused many to become timid. Why not pray powerful prayers? James says our prayers can be powerful and effective. "The whole wide world will be your possession". Make it personal. What type of praying could release your spirit to encounter Jesus and release the power of the Holy Spirit in you? (Acts 10:38)

This is a live-out school but an on-site accommodation option is available – see below

Walking in **victory** and wholeness is intended for **every Christian believer**, but many struggle to make this a **reality** in their walk.

- How do we pray for someone who has experienced abuse and receive healing ourselves?
- How do we pray for someone who is struggling with life controlling patterns?
- How do we pray effectively into trauma, unforgiveness, or a broken heart?

VMTC (Victorious Ministry Through Christ) provides **teaching** and **practical sessions** on healing, dealing with sin, bondages, destructive patterns, hurtful relationships and traumatic experiences.

Your Training Includes:

- Teaching & notes on healing from brokenness, bondages and the effects of trauma & hurtful relationships
- Your own confidential prayer ministry appointment
- Participation in Prayer Vigils
- Basic training in how to minister healing

A commitment to attend all sessions is a condition of enrolment

Costs:

A combined fee of \$150 covering registration (\$60) and meals & venue costs (\$90) (but not accommodation) will be required to be paid no later than 2 weeks before school. Please do not pay any fees prior to receiving final confirmation letter.

On-site accommodation in shared units available @ \$35-00 per person, per night Unit availability is limited & must be booked in advance & paid 2 weeks before school (with other fees). Morning & afternoon tea & dinner are provided. You will need to provide your own breakfast and lunch. The units and main hall contain kitchens.
