

Once again, UBC is excited to take part in the Ulverstone Christmas Parade.

Our desire is to engage the younger generation in our community

while gently pointing their hearts toward Jesus.

This year's float brings the Nativity to life - with every character dressed as they would appear in the Minecraft world.

Some of you may be wondering, "What is Minecraft?"

Minecraft is a popular video game (and more recently a movie that was released this year) where players can build, explore, and survive in a blocky, 3D world made entirely of cubes.

In Minecraft, you start with a simple world and then by using 3D blocks, time, care, and an imagination you can build an amazing world that includes houses, castles, farms, cities and forests. Minecraft is all about building and creating something strong, beautiful, and lasting. In the same way, God is the ultimate builder. He created the world and builds our lives with love and purpose.

When our lives are built on Jesus, the solid rock, we can stand strong no matter what comes, just like a Minecraft house that's built on strong blocks. In Matthew 7:24 Jesus said; "Everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock."

When Jesus was born, God started His greatest build ever. Not with gold or grand castles, but in a simple stable, with love and light. Just like in Minecraft, God used ordinary pieces: a stable, a manger, and a star. He then used people: Mary, Joseph, shepherds, kings and a tiny baby, to build something extraordinary.

The nativity is the first block of His rescue plan and a way for us to know His love forever.

Each side of our float, will feature a sign that reads, "Jesus, the heart of God's greatest build."

Please pray that our message will be seen and understood. That people will view our float more than simply joy and entertainment, but to recognise that Jesus coming into the world on that very first Christmas was God's plan to restore and rebuild a relationship with each one of us.


eRSONAL Prayer an Healing Ministry
